

Our Program

Students learn basic horse handling and care.

Depending on their capabilities, riders are responsible for grooming and helping to saddle their mounts. A typical lesson consists of riding instruction, as well as horse-related games and activities. All of our equipment meets the safety standards required for therapeutic riding.

Who We Serve

Red River Riders helps people with disabilities regardless of age. We began giving lessons in 1985 with 3 riders and 1 horse. We currently serve 60+ riders. We have served riders with hearing impairment, autism, cerebral palsy, and cognitive disabilities, as well as many other disabilities.

Classes

Classes run from May through October.

All sessions will have classes on Tuesday,

Wednesday, & Thursday.

Tuesday & Thursday classes are 4:00 & 5:15p.m.

Wednesday classes are 5:00 & 6:15p.m.

Volunteer Training

Held in May and June on the farm.

This is a hands-on opportunity to learn volunteering techniques for therapeutic horseback riding. Dress for farm work. We will be working with the horses & some may get a chance to ride.
